A Brief History of the Clinic

The Clinic opened its doors to patients on April 1, 1996. It was expected that the Clinic would see approximately 500-1000 visits each year. The Clinic now sees an average of 625 patients each month. The Clinic began an advisory group in 1997 to look at further development of the Clinic. From there, a planning group was convened in September 1998 for a series of meetings to chart to future of the clinic. From this group, a working advisory board was put in place.

In early 1998, the FHPC received funds for rent and utilities to open a satellite clinic in the Woodstock area. Other fund-raisers and donations supported this effort and a merger with the McHenry Free Clinic run by Dr. James Mowery was announced. The Woodstock clinic opened its doors in January 1999.

In October 1999, the Clinic officially spun off of its parent organization to become its own free standing 501 c 3. This change was a planned one, designed for the long-term future of the clinic. By becoming independent, the Clinic has more control over finances and program planning. The advisory board became the Board of Directors.

In January 2000, the board made the decision to close the Harvard clinic because of space concerns as well as financial ones. The Clinics consolidated into the Woodstock Clinic on March 1, 2000.

In August 2003, the Clinic moved its entire Clinic to a larger location at 13707 W. Jackson, Woodstock. This was facilitated through a generous offer by Centegra Health System who owns the building.

With the move into larger space, the Clinic was able to add several new programs including the nationally recognized Celebremos La Vida cancer screening and education program, a new diabetic education program, RxMatch community pharmaceutical program, along with several others. The Clinic added several physicians and nurse practitioners, and is now seeing more client visits in a month than we projected we would see in a year when the Clinic first opened.

Along this journey, staff and board have realized that the sheer numbers of people needing medical care far exceed what we can provide, but we are supported by the commitment and resources of people throughout the area. They help us keep our focus on our primary concern - our patients, old and young.

Dear Friends of the Clinic,

This year has been an interesting one, to say the least. We have seen the stock market plunge, businesses closing and large institutions being propped up by federal dollars to keep them solvent. All of this has a trickle down effect on organizations like ours. Many more people have lost their jobs and along with it, their health insurance. We have many more phone calls coming into the clinic needing services, but we've not been able to fill all of the requests.

On the other hand, the community support for the Clinic has only increased and we thank our loyal donors who understand that the needs have increased exponentially. We could not do our work without their support.

Despite this poor economy, the Clinic has had a busy and productive year. Thanks to a private family foundation, we were able to expand the front office work area to streamline work as well as increasing patient privacy. This improvement has made a significant difference in the patient flow and the efficiency of the workplace.

We also made great strides with our diabetic program. Thanks to a grant from the VNA Foundation, the Clinic was able to expand our services to our diabetics who showed marked improvement in the clinical indicators of quality care including lower A1c levels, and number of people receiving proper flu and pneumonia vaccine.

Other successes include adding 7 new volunteer physicians to the schedule, recruiting several new nurses to assist with both clinical and other duties, and bringing on the Woodstock High School Green Club to oversee the recycling program at the Clinic. Our annual gala was a success, and our fall breast cancer race had over 900 participants – a huge jump from last year. Additionally, we have started a monthly email newsletter with news of the Clinic to over 1000 people.

Last but not least, we have changed the logo thanks to the creative efforts of our friends at Studio One Zero Charlie who took on a big project in helping us get the word out better about who we are and what we do. You will see our new logo on letter head and on our pieces of information we send out.

We can only thank the community and our partners with the successes of this year and work we do. Thank you for helping us serve the many people that we do, and for allowing us to serve the community. We dedicate this work to you.

Why is the Family Health Partnership Clinic Important in Our Community?



In 2002, Alan was diagnosed with hypertension, diabetes and high cholesterol all at the same time. As Alan put it, “I was hit with a trifecta!”. He was unemployed at the time, but did have a small health care policy, but was considered underinsured. He was sent to Centegra Health System for his initial treatment which required a hospital stay. Once he was released, he was referred to FHPC for his continuing care to manage his three diseases. He remembers receiving complete care with an A1C test, education on his glucometer and education on his diet at his very first visit. Alan continues to come to the clinic to receive care and help with managing his health. He says, “If I had to hold off on care or wait until the last minute to get care (all because I could not afford it) I would be a very sick man!” “I thank FHPC for all the help, goodness you’ve given to me and I hope more doctors come with the helping spirit.”

In 2003, just after being diagnosed with diabetes, Linda became uninsured. With no way to pay for her appointments and A1C tests, Linda’s doctor referred her to FHPC. “I didn’t know about the clinic until I was referred. Without FHPC, my diabetes would have gone unchecked and I could have succumbed to the consequences of the disease.” Linda has worked closely with a nurse practitioner to manage her diabetes to ward off hypertension, obesity and heart disease. Linda, too, has had other ailments including a debilitated knee that was affecting her quality of life. Through the referral program at the clinic, Linda was connected to a local orthopedic doctor who performed knee surgery. She states, “I have my peace of mind back, my life is no longer in jeopardy, I feel good and have the support I need from everyone at FHPC”!

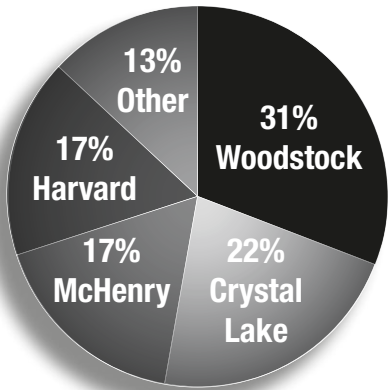

Dolores was attending a Junior College in 2003 when she became ill. She learned at school through other people about Family Health Partnership Clinic and the “excellent doctors” there. At one of her earlier appointments at the clinic, she shared symptoms with Dr. Brown. Her symptoms were indicative of possible lung cancer. Dolores was immediately referred to an oncologist and a definitive diagnosis of lung cancer was made. FHPC Nurse Practitioner, Donna Cox-Rodriguez gave the news to Dolores. Dolores said, “Donna remained upbeat about my situation and helped me onto an oncologist”. Dolores was connected with an oncologist who removed all of her tumor even though she had no health insurance. Dolores continues under the care of the clinic doctors for her diabetes and preventive breast cancer screenings. “Without the clinic, I would not have known what to do about my lung cancer, I may have died.”

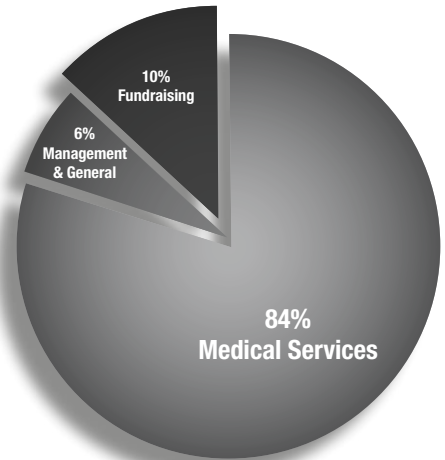
